MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF WILLOWBROOK HELD ON MONDAY, AUGUST 24, 2009, AT THE VILLAGE HALL, 7760 QUINCY STREET, IN THE VILLAGE OF WILLOWBROOK, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at the hour of 7:30 p.m. by Village President Robert Napoli.

2. ROLL CALL

Those present at roll call were Trustees Terrence Kelly, Michael Mistele, Paul Schoenbeck, Sandra O'Connor and President Napoli. ABSENT: Trustees Dennis Baker and Timothy McMahon. Also present were Village Clerk Leroy Hansen, Village Attorney William Hennessy, Chief of Police Edward Konstanty, Director of Municipal Services Timothy Halik, Director of Finance Sue Stanish, Planner Sara Hage and Administrative Intern Garrett Hummel.

A QUORUM WAS DECLARED

Trustee Baker entered the meeting at approximately 7:37 p.m.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Napoli asked everyone to join him in saying the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Napoli asked if any Board member wanted any item(s) removed from the Omnibus Vote Agenda for discussion. Trustee Schoenbeck requested that Agenda Item 4b be removed.

Trustee Schoenbeck requested that on page 3, third paragraph, "Trustee McMahon asked if there was something the Board has to do". It should be "Trustee Schoenbeck".

6. DELINQUENT WATER BILLS

Director Halik reported to the Board there were three (3) delinquent water bills in the amounts of \$189.98, \$294.93 and \$96.57, respectively. Each of these properties is a rental property. Director Halik requested permission to proceed in accordance with past Village policy.

7. RECOGNITION - WILLOWBROOK POLICE CADET AWARDS

Chief Konstanty informed the Board that the Willowbrook Police Cadets had recently participated in the Law Enforcement Explorer Training Conference held in Springfield. The Cadets earned first place in a number of areas. At this time he introduced Commander John Barnacle, who is the coordinator of the program.

Commander Barnacle thanked the Village Board for all the support they have given the Police Cadet Program. Without this support the program would not be as successful as it is. He also thanked Acting Village Administrator Chief Konstanty for his consistent support and guidance to the Cadet Program. Since 1992, over a hundred cadets have joined the program and eighteen of them have gone on to become police officers, federal agents, police sergeants, detectives and one former cadet is currently at West Point. There are currently seven cadets in the program and we are expecting two more applicants to join.

Since 1994, the Cadets have attended eight national explorer conferences and six state conferences which has resulted in over thirty awards in team and individual competitions. This year the Cadets attended the Illinois State Explorer Conference where they competed with over 250 explorers from thirty different departments. The Cadets competed in ten different competitions where they won three first place trophies in crime scene search,

traffic stops and felony arrests and a fourth place trophy in building search. Commander Barnacle noted that after the competition, the judges commented on how well our cadets work as a team and how well trained they were.

Commander Barnacle introduced the cadets who attended the conference and introduced the supervisors of the program, Debbie Hahn, Michael Kurinec, Michele Strugala and Dan Polfliet.

8. RESOLUTION - A RESOLUTION WAIVING THE COMPETITIVE BIDDING PROCESS AND AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT AND VILLAGE CLERK TO ACCEPT A PROPOSAL FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE WATER TANK REHABILITATION PROJECT - ERA VALDIVIA CONTRACTORS, INC.

Director Halik noted that bid specifications were previously prepared for a water tank repair project and all the bids came in higher than expected. The Village Board rejected all bids at the August 10, 2009 meeting.

Staff had a series of meetings with the consulting engineer and several bidders to try to determine why the bids came in so high. It seems that the scope of the repair work was expanded without due regard to the budget limitations. The engineer has since revised the scope of the work back down to include only the original list of items and the project low-bidder was asked to submit a proposal to complete the redefined project. Era Valdivia returned a proposal to complete the revised list of maintenance items on all three tanks for \$94,500. Staff would recommend that the Board approve the resolution waiving the competitive bidding process and accepting the proposal from Era Valdivia Contractors, Inc.

ITEM HISTORY (PREVIOUS VILLAGE BOARD REVIEWS, ACTIONS RELATED TO THIS ITEM, OTHER PERTINENT HISTORY)

At its regular meeting on April 27, 2009, the Village Board approved a contract with Dome Corporation of North America to construct a new rock salt storage building on the public works site. Construction began on July 20th, immediately after the final lift of asphalt was installed on site. At the present time, the dome structure is substantially completed with only the siding, roof covering, and electrical installations remaining.

ITEM COMMENTARY (BACKGROUND, DISCUSSION, RECOMMENDATIONS, ETC.)

Given this structure is now substantially completed, a request for partial payment was received by the contractor. The request was forwarded to the Architect of Record to review. Williams Architects has reviewed the request and has provided their approval of a partial payout in the amount of \$99,645.50. We have received certified payroll accounting from each of the sub-contractors, and partial waivers of liens. A complete copy of the Payment #1 – Partial Payment Request is attached.

Staff would recommend that the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize Payout #1 – Partial Payment to Dome Corporation of North America in the amount of \$99,645.50. The authorized payment amount would be expended from the following fund:

ITEM HISTORY (PREVIOUS VILLAGE BOARD REVIEWS, ACTIONS RELATED TO THIS ITEM, PERTINENT HISTORY)

At its regular meeting on September 8, 2008, the Village Board approved a contract with FBG Construction Corporation to construct the new public works garage. Work on this project is now nearly complete. The public works department is finalizing the move, and now operates out of the new facility. Staff has met with both the project architect and representatives of the general contracting firm on several occasions to coordinate the completion of all punchlist items and close-out the project.

ITEM COMMENTARY (BACKGROUND, DISCUSSION, RECOMMENDATIONS, ETC.)

A request for a tenth partial payment was received from the general contractor. The request was forwarded to the Architect of Record to review. Williams Architects has reviewed the request and has provided their approval of a partial payout in the amount of \$210,078.94. We have received a partial waiver of lien from the general contractor. A complete copy of the Payment #10 – Partial Payment Request is attached.

The current payout request will serve to substantially finalize the project and payment to FBG, except for two items:

- Installation of the electrical conductors within the existing raceway to serve the salt dome structure (\$2,000).
- Replacement of dead and/or dying landscape plantings throughout the site (\$1,720).

Although both of the above items are scheduled to be completed this month, \$3,720 has been withheld from the payment until this work is completed and approved. Therefore, once this work is completed, a Final Payout to FBG will be processed in the amount of \$3,720.

Staff would recommend that the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize Payout #10 – Partial Payment to FBG Construction Corporation in the amount of \$210,078.94. The authorized payment amount would be expended from the following building construction fund:

On 9/2/09, the Plan Commission voted to recommend approval of a petition to rezone the property located at 7904 Joliet Road (the Vis-O-Graphics property) to the M-1 district. The Plan Commission's recommendation is attached, along with Staff's Report to the Plan Commission.

ITEM COMMENTARY (BACKGROUND, DISCUSSION, KEY POINTS, RECOMMENDATIONS, ETC.)

In November 2007, the Village voluntarily annexed the House of Trucks and forcibly annexed the remaining unincorporated parcels within the Joliet Road/79th Street/I-55 triangle, including the Dahlke's Vis-O-Graphics building and property.

As required by state law, upon annexation, the Vis-O-Graphics property was automatically zoned to the Village of Willowbrook's most restrictive residential zoning classification, which is R-1. This is the default zoning upon annexation and remains in effect until such time as the property owner requests and receives approval to rezone the property to an alternate district.

Although the property has been zoned R-1 since it was forcibly annexed, it does not preclude the Dahlke's from continuing the current use of the property, which has been a printing press shop and administrative offices. Any new use would trigger the need to rezone the property to a more appropriate district such as the M-1. The Dahlke's request to rezone the property to the M-1 district would allow for uses that are compatible with surrounding uses and facilitate a sale of the property.

No public comments were received either prior to or during the public hearing for the rezoning.

Site Description:

The .90-acre site is currently improved with two (2) separate connected structures served by a gravel drive access and parking area.

The structure to the north contains approximately 5,667 square feet of floor area and was built in 1945. The structure to the south was built in 1986 and contains approximately 2,437 square feet of floor area. The two buildings are connected by an open corridor.

Background:

In November 2007, the Village annexed the House of Trucks at the request of the House of Trucks' property owner. Immediately after the annexation of the House of Trucks, the Village forcibly annexed the remaining unincorporated parcels within the Joliet Road/79th Street/I-55 triangle, including the Dahlke's Vis-O-Graphics building and property.

As required by state law, upon annexation, the Vis-O-Graphics property was automatically zoned to the Village of Willowbrook's most restrictive residential zoning classification (R-1). This is the default zoning upon annexation until such time as the property owner requests rezoning to an alternate district.

Although the property has been zoned R-1 since it was forcibly annexed, it has not precluded the Dahlke's from continuing the current use of the property, which has been a printing press shop and administrative offices. The Dahlke's have been attempting to sell their property to a new user. Any new use would trigger the need to rezone the property to a more appropriate district. The Dahlke's request to rezone the property to the M-1 district would allow for appropriate uses of the building and site and facilitate a sale of the property.

Development Proposal:

At this time, there are no plans for expansion of the building. Any future expansion or alteration of the structure could trigger the need for variations from the Zoning Ordinance.

Staff Analysis:

Appropriateness of Use:

The continued use of the property for light manufacturing activities will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, comfort or general welfare of the community. Rezoning to the M-1 district is consistent with past uses for the property and the surrounding neighborhood. The rezoning would allow Vis-O-Graphics printing operations or other light manufacturing use to operate legally within the Village of Willowbrook.

Variations:

The applicant has not requested any variations from the Zoning Ordinance.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Plan Commission recommend to the President and Village Board approval of the request to rezone to the M-1 district the property located at 7904 Joliet Road as submitted on behalf of the Robert V. and Mary J. Dahlke Trust in an application received on July 21, 2009.

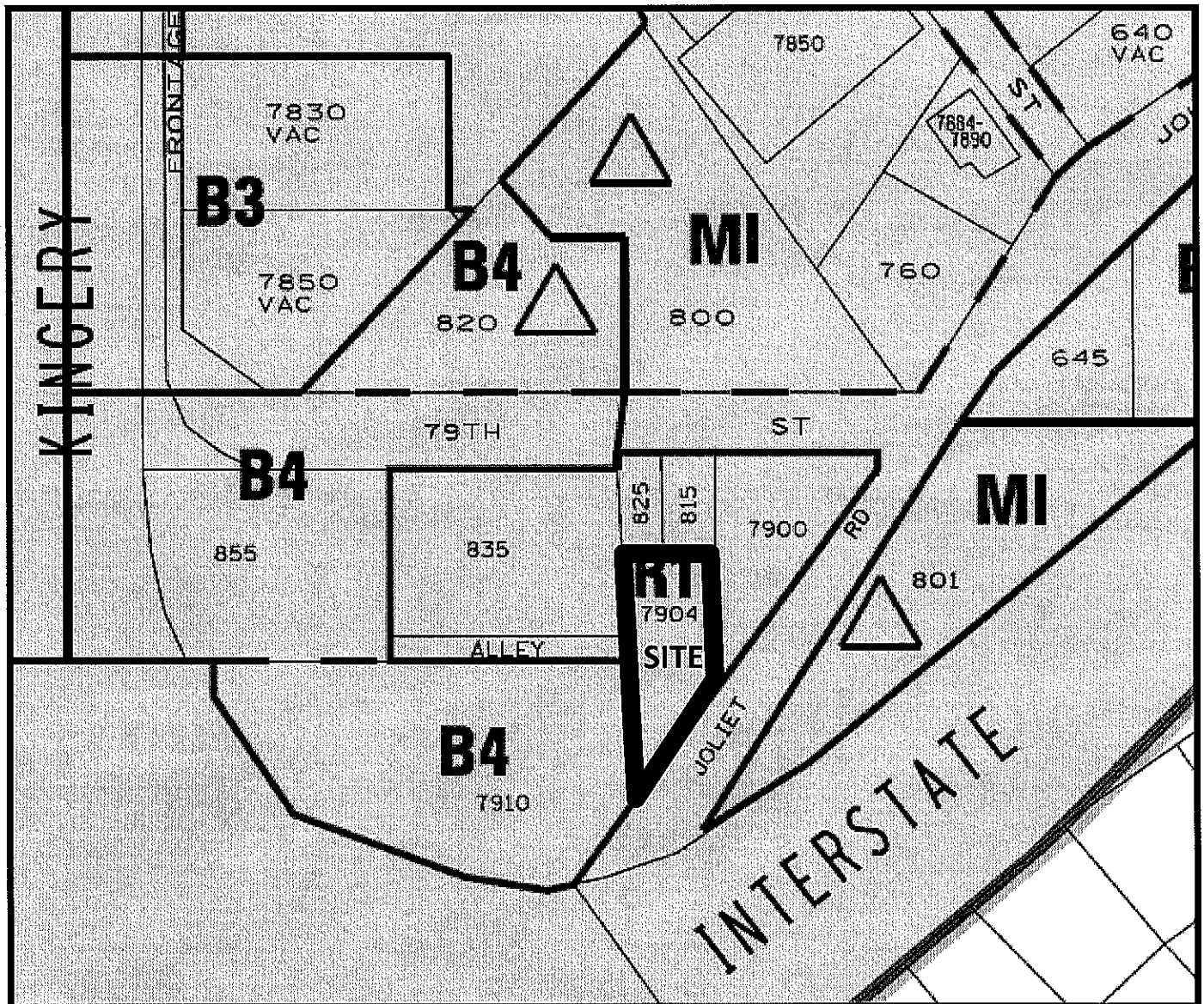

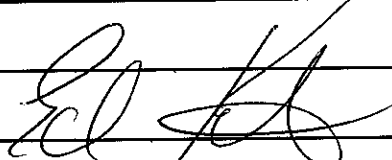

ITEM HISTORY (PREVIOUS VILLAGE BOARD REVIEWS, ACTIONS RELATED TO THIS ITEM, PERTINENT HISTORY)

This season's Roadway Maintenance Program will include significant full-depth roadway patching on various streets, crack filling the remaining twenty (20) streets that were not completed in the 2007 Program, and the replacement of thermoplastic pavement markings (i.e., re-striping) at various locations in which the previous markings are extremely worn. In addition to this right-of-way work, this year's program will also include crack filling, seal coating, and re-striping of the parking facilities at the Village Hall, Community Park, and Willow Pond Park, which was budgeted within the General Fund.

Since the majority of the funding for this work will come from the Village Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) Fund, the construction bid documents were submitted to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for approval prior to going out to public bid. Once both the Municipal Services Committee and IDOT reviewed and approved the bid document, the project was put out to bid. The public bid opening was held at the Village Hall on Tuesday, August 25, 2009 at 9:00 AM.

Crowley-Sheppard Asphalt, Inc.	\$119,635.75

Although only one (1) bid was received, it was a favorable price. Crowley-Sheppard is an IDOT pre-qualified bidder based out of Chicago Ridge. They have performed work in the Village in the past, including the reconstruction of 59th Street from Clarendon Hills Road to Western Avenue, and the recent replacement of the basketball court in Community Park. The company is well qualified to complete our roadway maintenance program this year.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff would recommend that the attached resolution authorizing the Village President and Village Clerk to award the contract for the 2009 MFT Roadway Maintenance Program to Crowley-Sheppard Asphalt, Inc. in the amount of \$119,635.75 be adopted. Once the Village Board awards the contract, the contract will then be sent to IDOT for final approval. Once IDOT approves the contract, the Village can issue a notice to proceed to the contractor, and the work will begin. Staff anticipates that the work would commence by the end of September.

MAINTENANCE OF ROADWAYS

Beginning on the date that the CONTRACTOR begins work on this project, he shall assume responsibility for normal maintenance of all existing roadways within the limits of the improvement. This normal maintenance shall include all repair work deemed necessary by the VILLAGE, but shall not include snow removal operations. Traffic control and protection for this work will be provided by the CONTRACTOR as required by the VILLAGE.

The work involved in maintaining the existing pavement will be paid for separately at the contract unit prices for the various items of work involved, unless otherwise specified elsewhere in these Special Provisions. Traffic control and protection, and detour route will be paid for as stated in the contract. No construction activity shall begin until all proper signs and barricades have been installed. There shall be no equipment or material storage on the pavement, temporary or otherwise. All driveways must have access each night except during the curb and gutter and driveway apron removal and replacement process. In the event a driveway is not open at the end of the workday, \$500 per incident will be deducted from monies due to the contractor.

The CONTRACTOR shall not prime coat any streets overnight. In the event the CONTRACTOR does prime coat a street the night before paving, a \$1,000.00 per incident will be deducted from monies due to the CONTRACTOR.

No garbage shall be disposed of by the CONTRACTOR on the project site. In the event the CONTRACTOR does dispose of garbage on the project site a \$500.00 per incident will be deducted from monies due to the CONTRACTOR.

If items of work have not been provided for in the contract, or otherwise specified for payment, such items, including the accompanying traffic control and protection, and detour route required by the VILLAGE, will be paid for in accordance with Article 109.04 of the STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS.

In the event the CONTRACTOR leaves the aggregate base course exposed commencing on the third night following the start of pavement removal, a \$5,000 per night per street will be deducted from monies due to the CONTRACTOR. A time extension may be granted by the engineer for unforeseen weather conditions that occur prior to the start of liquidated damages.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The Contractor shall obtain, erect, maintain, and remove all signs, barricades, flagman, and other traffic control devices as may be necessary for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic. Placement and maintenance of all traffic control devices shall be as directed by the Engineer and in accordance with the applicable parts of Article 107.14 of Standard Specifications and the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. All traffic protection will be considered incidental to the cost of the Contract and will not be paid for separately.

PREVAILING WAGE

Not less than the prevailing rate of wages as found by the Village of Willowbrook or the Department of Labor or determined by the Court on review shall be paid to all laborers, workman and mechanics performing work under this contract.

QUALITY CONTROL

The Village of Willowbrook will collect tickets for all material utilized on the project on a daily basis or as directed by the Engineer.

TRUCK WEIGHTS

The Village may require the contractor to reweigh any trucks to verify the ticket weight at any time during the job at a certified scale. All truck loads shall be within the tolerable limits of the scales and shall be legal.

SITE INSPECTION

It is recommended that the contractor inspect the sites subsequent to award of this contract to familiarize him or herself with existing conditions. There will be various streets within Village limits of which this work will apply, they are specified in the proposal.

NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC UTILITIES

The Contractor shall notify ComEd, Nicor Gas, and SBC at JULIE 800-892-0123, and the Village Engineer of the Village of Willowbrook 847-823-0500, at least two (2) working days in advance of commencement of construction for locations of their underground lines.

COMPLIANCE WITH CODES

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to whom this Contract is awarded to familiarize himself and comply with the contents of the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA), codes and ordinances adopted by and in effect by Federal, State, County, Township, and Village Governmental Bodies, and any other governmental agencies at any level having jurisdiction over this area and this type of work. Any additional costs resulting from compliance with these codes shall be considered incidental to the Contract.

NOTIFICATION OF POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS

The Contractor shall advise the Police and Fire Departments daily as to what streets will be under construction and what streets, if any, are to be closed so that they can reroute their emergency vehicles.

SAW CUTTING

All saw cutting shall be incidental to the contract.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor shall follow Section 107 of the Illinois Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction. The insurance shall also name the Village of Willowbrook and Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd., as additional insured.

SIGN RELOCATE

The CONTRACTOR shall remove and relocate all street signs located in or near the construction zone as directed by the ENGINEER. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for replacing at his expense any signs damaged during the course of construction and the operation of removing and relocating any signs. The removal and relocation of all existing signs within the construction limits shall not be paid for separately but shall be incidental to the contract.

VANDALISM

Special attention is called to Article 107.30 of the STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS. Any defaced work shall be corrected or replaced by the CONTRACTOR at his sole expense prior to final payment. The VILLAGE shall cooperate with the CONTRACTOR to minimize vandalism, but the CONTRACTOR shall be ultimately responsible to correct any damage.

STREET CLEANING

Special attention shall be paid to Section 107.15 of the STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS. If the CONTRACTOR fails to clean the pavement, sidewalk or parkways on or adjacent to the section under construction to the satisfaction of the ENGINEER at any time during the contract, the ENGINEER will notify the CONTRACTOR at which time the CONTRACTOR will have 4 hours to respond.

If the CONTRACTOR fails to respond within 4 hours an amount of \$500.00 per incident will be deducted from any monies due the CONTRACTOR.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND SAFETY

In addition to the requirements of Article 107.09 of the STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS, the CONTRACTOR shall maintain entrances and side roads along the proposed improvement; interference with traffic movements and inconvenience to owners of abutting property and public shall be kept to a minimum. Any delays or inconveniences caused the CONTRACTOR by complying with these requirements shall be considered as incidental to the contract, and no additional compensation will be allowed.

The CONTRACTOR is to plan his work so that there will be no open holes in the pavement and that all barricades will be removed from the pavement during non-work hours.

During all construction operations, the CONTRACTOR will be required to provide, erect and maintain proper signage and barricades plus provide flagmen as necessary for safe traffic control.

All provisions relating to traffic control, signage, barricades and the use of flagmen shall be subject to the approval of the ENGINEER.

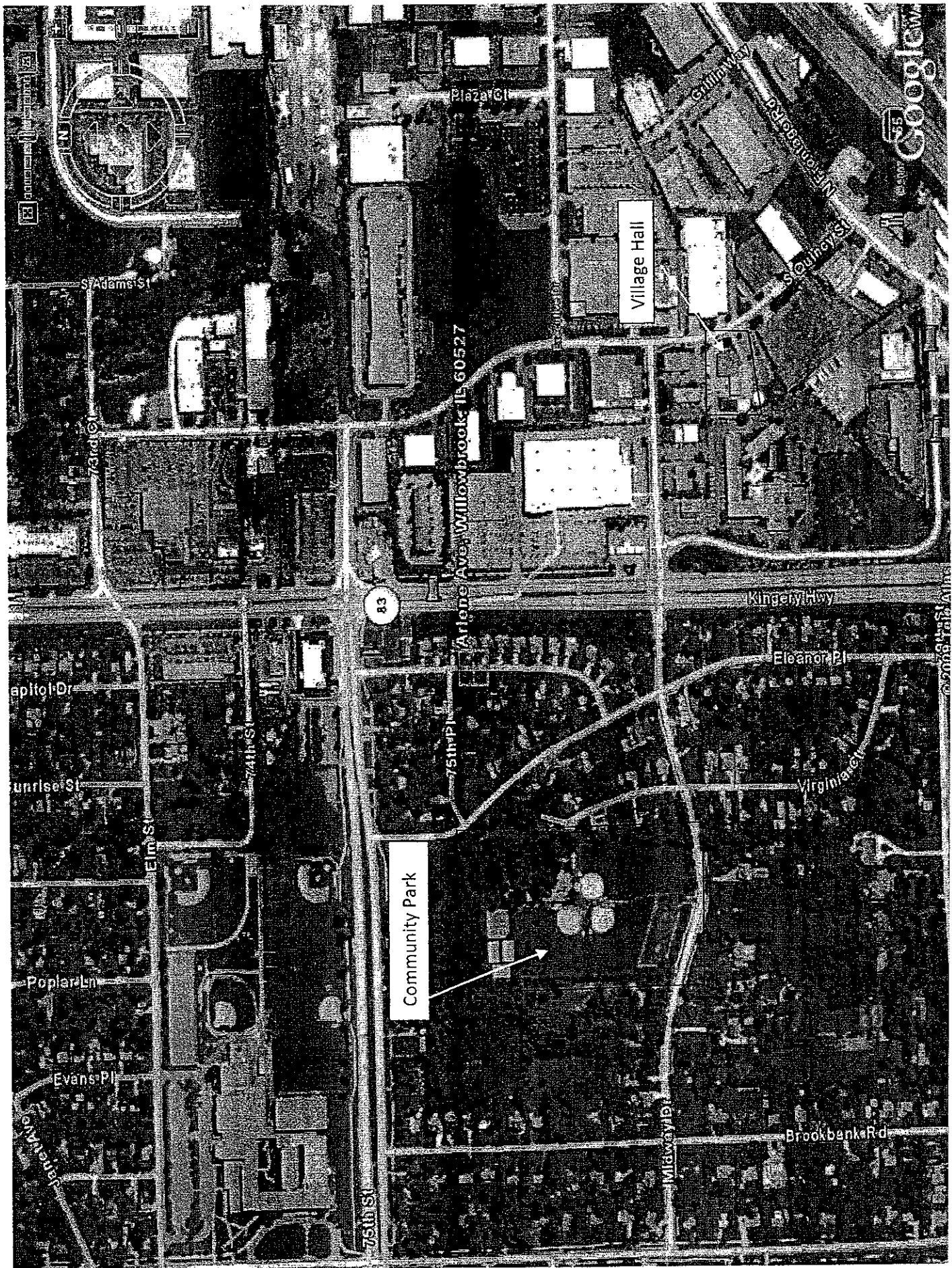
Village of Willowbrook Location Map 1

BITUMINOUS MATERIALS COST ADJUSTMENTS (BDE) (RETURN FORM WITH BID)

Effective: November 2, 2006

Revised: April 1, 2009

Description. Bituminous material cost adjustments will be made to provide additional compensation to the Contractor, or credit to the Department, for fluctuations in the cost of bituminous materials when optioned by the Contractor. The adjustments shall apply to permanent and temporary hot-mix asphalt (HMA) mixtures, bituminous surface treatments (cover and seal coats), and pavement preservation type surface treatments. The adjustments shall not apply to bituminous prime coats, tack coats, crack filling/sealing, or joint filling/sealing.

The bidder shall indicate on the attached form whether or not this special provision will be part of the contract and submit the completed form with his/her bid. Failure to submit the form, or failure to fill out the form completely, shall make this contract exempt of bituminous materials cost adjustments.

Method of Adjustment. Bituminous materials cost adjustments will be computed as follows.

$$CA = (BPI_P - BPI_L) \times (\%AC_V / 100) \times Q$$

Where: CA = Cost Adjustment, \$.

BPI_P = Bituminous Price Index, as published by the Department for the month the work is performed, \$/ton (\$/metric ton).

BPI_L = Bituminous Price Index, as published by the Department for the month prior to the letting, \$/ton (\$/metric ton).

%AC_V = Percent of virgin Asphalt Cement in the Quantity being adjusted. For HMA mixtures, the % AC_V will be determined from the adjusted job mix formula. For bituminous materials applied, a performance graded or cutback asphalt will be considered to be 100% AC_V and undiluted emulsified asphalt will be considered to be 65% AC_V.

Q = Authorized construction Quantity, tons (metric tons) (see below).

For HMA mixtures measured in square yards: $Q, \text{ tons} = A \times D \times (G_{mb} \times 46.8) / 2000$. For HMA mixtures measured in square meters: $Q, \text{ metric tons} = A \times D \times (G_{mb} \times 24.99) / 1000$. When computing adjustments for full-depth HMA pavement, separate calculations will be made for the binder and surface courses to account for their different G_{mb} and % AC_V.

For bituminous materials measured in gallons: $Q, \text{ tons} = V \times 8.33 \text{ lb/gal} \times SG / 2000$

For bituminous materials measured in liters: $Q, \text{ metric tons} = V \times 1.0 \text{ kg/L} \times SG / 1000$

Where: A = Area of the HMA mixture, sq yd (sq m).

D = Depth of the HMA mixture, in. (mm).

G_{mb} = Average bulk specific gravity of the mixture, from the approved mix design.

V = Volume of the bituminous material, gal (L).

SG = Specific Gravity of bituminous material as shown on the bill of lading.

Basis of Payment. Bituminous materials cost adjustments may be positive or negative but will only be made when there is a difference between the BPI_L and BPI_P in excess of five percent, as calculated by:

$$\text{Percent Difference} = \{(BPI_L - BPI_P) \div BPI_L\} \times 100$$

Bituminous materials cost adjustments will be calculated for each calendar month in which applicable bituminous material is placed; and will be paid or deducted when all other contract requirements for the work placed during the month are satisfied. The adjustments shall not apply during contract time subject to liquidated damages for completion of the entire contract.

CONSTRUCTION AIR QUALITY - DIESEL VEHICLE EMISSIONS CONTROL (BDE)

Effective: April 1, 2009

Revised: July 1, 2009

Diesel Vehicle Emissions Control. The reduction of construction air emissions shall be accomplished by using cleaner burning diesel fuel. The term "equipment" refers to any and all diesel fuel powered devices rated at 50 hp and above, to be used on the project site in excess of seven calendar days over the course of the construction period on the project site (including any "rental" equipment).

All equipment on the jobsite, with engine ratings of 50 hp and above, shall be required to: use Ultra Low Sulfur Diesel fuel (ULSD) exclusively (15 ppm sulfur content or less).

Diesel powered equipment in non-compliance will not be allowed to be used on the project site, and is also subject to a notice of non-compliance as outlined below.

The Contractor shall submit copies of monthly summary reports and include certified copies of the ULSD diesel fuel delivery slips for diesel fuel delivered to the jobsite for the reporting time period, noting the quantity of diesel fuel used.

If any diesel powered equipment is found to be in non-compliance with any portion of this specification, the Engineer will issue the Contractor a notice of non-compliance and identify an appropriate period of time, as outlined below under environmental deficiency deduction, in which to bring the equipment into compliance or remove it from the project site.

Any costs associated with bringing any diesel powered equipment into compliance with these diesel vehicle emissions controls shall be considered as included in the contract unit prices bid for the various items of work involved and no additional compensation will be allowed. The Contractor's compliance with this notice and any associated regulations shall also not be grounds for a claim.

Environmental Deficiency Deduction. When the Engineer is notified, or determines that an environmental control deficiency exists, he/she will notify the Contractor in writing, and direct the Contractor to correct the deficiency within a specified time period. The specified time-period, which begins upon Contractor notification, will be from 1/2 hour to 24 hours long, based on the urgency of the situation and the nature of the deficiency. The Engineer shall be the sole judge regarding the time period.

The deficiency will be based on lack of repair, maintenance and diesel vehicle emissions control.

If the Contractor fails to correct the deficiency within the specified time frame, a daily monetary deduction will be imposed for each calendar day or fraction thereof the deficiency continues to exist. The calendar day(s) will begin when the time period for correction is exceeded and end

with the Engineer's written acceptance of the correction. The daily monetary deduction will be \$1,000.00 for each deficiency identified.

If a Contractor or subcontractor accumulates three environmental deficiency deductions in a contract period, the Contractor will be shutdown until the deficiency is corrected. Such a shutdown will not be grounds for any extension of contract time, waiver of penalties, or be grounds for any claim.

CONSTRUCTION AIR QUALITY - IDLING RESTRICTIONS (BDE)

Effective: April 1, 2009

Idling Restrictions. The Contractor shall establish truck-staging areas for all diesel powered vehicles that are waiting to load or unload material at the jobsite. Staging areas shall be located where the diesel emissions from the equipment will have a minimum impact on adjacent sensitive receptors. The Department will review the selection of staging areas, whether within or outside the existing highway right-of-way, to avoid locations near sensitive areas or populations to the extent possible. Sensitive receptors include, but are not limited to, hospitals, schools, residences, motels, hotels, daycare facilities, elderly housing and convalescent facilities. Diesel powered engines shall also be located as far away as possible from fresh air intakes, air conditioners, and windows. The Engineer will approve staging areas before implementation.

Diesel powered vehicle operators may not cause or allow the motor vehicle, when it is not in motion, to idle for more than a total of 10 minutes within any 60 minute period, except under any of the following circumstances:

- 1) The motor vehicle has a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 8000 lb (3630 kg) .
- 2) The motor vehicle idles while forced to remain motionless because of on-highway traffic, an official traffic control device or signal, or at the direction of a law enforcement official.
- 3) The motor vehicle idles when operating defrosters, heaters, air conditioners, or other equipment solely to prevent a safety or health emergency.
- 4) A police, fire, ambulance, public safety, other emergency or law enforcement motor vehicle, or any motor vehicle used in an emergency capacity, idles while in an emergency or training mode and not for the convenience of the vehicle operator.
- 5) The primary propulsion engine idles for maintenance, servicing, repairing, or diagnostic purposes if idling is necessary for such activity.
- 6) A motor vehicle idles as part of a government inspection to verify that all equipment is in good working order, provided idling is required as part of the inspection.
- 7) When idling of the motor vehicle is required to operate auxiliary equipment to accomplish the intended use of the vehicle (such as loading, unloading, mixing, or processing cargo; controlling cargo temperature; construction operations, lumbering operations; oil or gas well servicing; or farming operations), provided that this exemption does not apply when the vehicle is idling solely for cabin comfort or to operate non-essential equipment such as air conditioning, heating, microwave ovens, or televisions.
- 8) When the motor vehicle idles due to mechanical difficulties over which the operator has no control.
- 9) The outdoor temperature is less than 32 °F (0 °C) or greater than 80 °F (26 °C).

When the outdoor temperature is greater than or equal to 32 °F (0 °C) or less than or equal to 80 °F (26 °C), a person who operates a motor vehicle operating on diesel fuel shall not cause or allow the motor vehicle to idle for a period greater than 30 minutes in any 60 minute period while waiting to weigh, load, or unload cargo or freight, unless the vehicle is in a line of vehicles that regularly and periodically moves forward.

The above requirements do not prohibit the operation of an auxiliary power unit or generator set as an alternative to idling the main engine of a motor vehicle operating on diesel fuel.

Environmental Deficiency Deduction. When the Engineer is notified, or determines that an environmental control deficiency exists based on non-compliance with the idling restrictions, he/she will notify the Contractor, and direct the Contractor to correct the deficiency.

If the Contractor fails to correct the deficiency a monetary deduction will be imposed. The monetary deduction will be \$1,000.00 for each deficiency identified.

EQUIPMENT RENTAL RATES (BDE)

Effective: August 2, 2007

Revised: January 2, 2008

Replace the second and third paragraphs of Article 105.07(b)(4)a. of the Standard Specifications with the following:

"Equipment idled which cannot be used on other work, and which is authorized to standby on the project site by the Engineer, will be paid for according to Article 109.04(b)(4)."

Replace Article 109.04(b)(4) of the Standard Specifications with the following:

"(4) Equipment. Equipment used for extra work shall be authorized by the Engineer. The equipment shall be specifically described, be of suitable size and capacity for the work to be performed, and be in good operating condition. For such equipment, the Contractor will be paid as follows.

- a. Contractor Owned Equipment. Contractor owned equipment will be paid for by the hour using the applicable FHWA hourly rate from the "Equipment Watch Rental Rate Blue Book" (Blue Book) in effect when the force account work begins. The FHWA hourly rate is calculated as follows.

$$\text{FHWA hourly rate} = (\text{monthly rate}/176) \times (\text{model year adj.}) \times (\text{Illinois adj.}) + \text{EOC}$$

Where: EOC = Estimated Operating Costs per hour (from the Blue Book)

The time allowed will be the actual time the equipment is operating on the extra work. For the time required to move the equipment to and from the site of the extra work and any authorized idle (standby) time, payment will be made at the following hourly rate: $0.5 \times (\text{FHWA hourly rate} - \text{EOC})$.

All time allowed shall fall within the working hours authorized for the extra work.

The rates above include the cost of fuel, oil, lubrication, supplies, small tools, necessary attachments, repairs, overhaul and maintenance of any kind, depreciation, storage, overhead, profits, insurance, and all incidentals. The rates do not include labor.

The Contractor shall submit to the Engineer sufficient information for each piece of equipment and its attachments to enable the Engineer to determine the proper equipment category. If a rate is not established in the Blue Book for a particular piece of equipment, the Engineer will establish a rate for that piece of equipment that is consistent with its cost and use in the industry.

- b. Rented Equipment. Whenever it is necessary for the Contractor to rent equipment to perform extra work, the rental and transportation costs of the equipment plus five percent for overhead will be paid. In no case shall the rental rates exceed those of established distributors or equipment rental agencies.

All prices shall be agreed to in writing before the equipment is used."

FLAGGER AT SIDE ROADS AND ENTRANCES (BDE)

Effective: April 1, 2009

Revise the second paragraph of Article 701.13(a) of the Standard Specifications to read:

General. The fuel cost adjustment shall apply to contract pay items as grouped by category. (4) Category D: Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) Bases, Pavements and Shoulders. Contract pay items constructed under Sections 353, 420, 421 and 483 including any modified standard or nonstandard items where the character of the work to be performed is considered PCC base, pavement or shoulder. The cumulative total of all applicable item plan quantities shall exceed 7500 sq yd (6000 sq m). Included in the fuel usage factor is 1.20 gal/cu yd (5.94 liters/cu m) factor for trucking.

(5) Category E: Structures. Structure items having a cumulative bid price that exceeds \$250,000 for pay items constructed under Sections 502, 503, 504, 505, 512, 516 and 540 including any modified standard or nonstandard items where the character of the work to be performed is considered structure work when similar to that performed under these sections and not included in categories A through D.

HOT-MIX ASPHALT – TRANSPORTATION (BDE)

Effective: April 1, 2008

"1030.08 Transportation. Vehicles used in transporting HMA shall have clean and tight beds. The beds shall be sprayed with asphalt release agents from the Department's approved list. In lieu of a release agent, the Contractor may use a light spray of water with a light scatter of manufactured sand (FA 20 or FA 21) evenly distributed over the bed of the vehicle. - (b) The weather is inclement.
- (c) The temperature of the HMA immediately behind the paver screed is below 250 °F (120 °C).

The cover shall extend down over the sides and ends of the bed for a distance of approximately 12 in. (300 mm) and shall be fastened securely. The covering shall be rolled back before the load is dumped into the finishing machine."

PAYMENTS TO SUBCONTRACTORS (BDE)

Effective: June 1, 2000

Revised: January 1, 2006

Federal regulations found at 49 CFR §26.29 mandate the Department to establish a contract clause to require Contractors to pay subcontractors for satisfactory performance of their subcontracts and to set the time for such payments.

State law also addresses the timing of payments to be made to subcontractors and material suppliers. Section 7 of the Prompt Payment Act, 30 ILCS 540/7, requires that when a Contractor receives any payment from the Department, the Contractor shall make corresponding, proportional payments to each subcontractor and material supplier performing work or supplying material within 15 calendar days after receipt of the Department payment. Section 7 of the Act further provides that interest in the amount of two percent per month, in addition to the payment due, shall be paid to any subcontractor or material supplier by the Contractor if the payment required by the Act is withheld or delayed without reasonable cause. The Act also provides that the time for payment required and the calculation of any interest due applies to transactions between subcontractors and lower-tier subcontractors and material suppliers throughout the contracting chain.

This Special Provision establishes the required federal contract clause, and adopts the 15 calendar day requirement of the State Prompt Payment Act for purposes of compliance with the federal regulation regarding payments to subcontractors. This contract is subject to the following payment obligations.

When progress payments are made to the Contractor according to Article 109.07 of the Standard Specifications, the Contractor shall make a corresponding payment to each subcontractor and material supplier in proportion to the work satisfactorily completed by each subcontractor and for the material supplied to perform any work of the contract. The proportionate amount of partial payment due to each subcontractor and material supplier throughout the contracting chain shall be determined by the quantities measured or otherwise determined as eligible for payment by the Department and included in the progress payment to the Contractor. Subcontractors and material suppliers shall be paid by the Contractor within 15 calendar days after the receipt of payment from the Department. The Contractor shall not hold retainage from the subcontractors. These obligations shall also apply to any payments made by subcontractors and material suppliers to their subcontractors and material suppliers; and to all payments made to lower tier subcontractors and material suppliers throughout the contracting chain. Any payment or portion of a payment subject to this provision may only be withheld from the subcontractor or material supplier to whom it is due for reasonable cause.

This Special Provision does not create any rights in favor of any subcontractor or material supplier against the State or authorize any cause of action against the State on account of any payment, nonpayment, delayed payment, or interest claimed by application of the State Prompt Payment Act. The Department will not approve any delay or postponement of the 15 day requirement except for reasonable cause shown after notice and hearing pursuant to Section

| 7(b) of the State Prompt Payment Act. State law creates other and additional remedies available to any subcontractor or material supplier, regardless of tier, who has not been paid for work properly performed or material furnished. These remedies are a lien against public funds set forth in Section 23(c) of the Mechanics Lien Act, 770 ILCS 60/23(c), and a recovery on the Contractor's payment bond according to the Public Construction Bond Act, 30 ILCS 550.

THERMOPLASTIC PAVEMENT MARKINGS (BDE)

Effective: January 1, 2007

Revise Article 1095.01(a)(2) of the Standard Specifications to read:

- “(2) Pigment. The pigment used for the white thermoplastic compound shall be a high-grade pure (minimum 93 percent) titanium dioxide (TiO₂). The white pigment content shall be a minimum of ten percent by weight and shall be uniformly distributed throughout the thermoplastic compound.

The pigments used for the yellow thermoplastic compound shall not contain any hazardous materials listed in the Environmental Protection Agency Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 40, Section 261.24, Table 1. The combined total of RCRA listed heavy metals shall not exceed 100 ppm when tested by X-ray fluorescence spectroscopy. "Gradation. The fine aggregate gradation for all HMA shall be FA1, FA 2, FA 20, FA 21 or FA 22. When Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement (RAP) is incorporated in the HMA design, the use of FA 21 Gradation will not be permitted.

HOT MIX ASPHALT – DENSITY TESTING OF LONGITUDINAL JOINTS (D-1)

Effective: January 1, 2007

Revised: January 8, 2009

Description: This work shall consist of testing the density of longitudinal joints as part of the quality control / quality assurance (QC/QA) of hot-mix asphalt (HMA). This work shall be according to Section 1030 of the Standard Specifications except as follows.

Definitions:

Density Test Location: The station location used for density testing.

Density Test Site: Individual test site where a single density value is determined.

Density Reading: A single, one minute nuclear density reading.

Density Value: The density determined at a given density test site from the average of two "density readings".

Quality Control / Quality Assurance (QC/QA)

1030.05(d) (3) add the following paragraphs:

Longitudinal joint density testing shall be performed at each random "density test location". Longitudinal joint testing shall be located at a distance equal to the lift thickness, or a minimum of two inches, from each pavement edge. For Example, on a four inch HMA lift the near edge of the nuclear gauge or core barrel shall be within four inches from the edge of pavement. The remaining 3 density test sites shall be equally spaced between the two edge readings. Documentation shall indicate whether the joint was confined or unconfined.

The joint density value shall be determined using either a correlated nuclear gauge or cores. When using a correlated nuclear gauge, two "density readings" shall be taken at the given density test site. The gauge shall be rotated 180 degrees between "density readings". If the two "density readings" are not within 1.5 lb/cu ft (23 kg/cu m) then one additional "density reading" shall be taken. Additional "density readings" taken at a given site shall not be allowed to replace the original "density readings" unless an error has occurred (i.e. the nuclear gauge was sitting on debris).

USE OF RAP (DIST 1)

Effective: January 1, 2007

Revised: January 7, 2009

In Article 1030.02(g) of the Standard Specifications, delete the last sentence of the first paragraph in (Note 2).

Revise Section 1031 of the Standard Specifications to read:

"SECTION 1031. RECLAIMED ASPHALT PAVEMENT

1031.01 Description. Reclaimed asphalt pavement (RAP) results from the cold milling or crushing of an existing hot-mix asphalt (HMA) pavement. The Contractor shall supply written documentation that the RAP originated from routes or airfields under federal, state, or local agency jurisdiction. The contractor can also request that a processed pile be tested by the Department to determine the aggregate quality.

1031.02 Stockpiles. The Contractor shall construct individual, sealed RAP stockpiles meeting one of the following definitions. No additional RAP shall be added to the pile after the pile has been sealed. Stockpiles shall be sufficiently separated to prevent intermingling at the base. Stockpiles shall be identified by signs indicating the type and size as listed below (i.e. "Homogenous Surface").

Prior to milling or removal of an HMA pavement, the Contractor may request the District to provide verification of the existing mix composition to clarify appropriate stockpile.

- (a) Homogeneous. Homogeneous RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), HMA (High ESAL), or equivalent mixtures and represent: 1) the same aggregate quality, but shall be at least C quality; 2) the same type of crushed aggregate (either crushed natural aggregate, ACBF slag, or steel slag); 3) similar gradation; and 4) similar asphalt binder content. If approved by the Engineer, combined single pass surface/binder millings may be considered "homogenous" with a quality rating dictated by the lowest coarse aggregate quality present in the mixture.
- (b) Conglomerate 5/8. Conglomerate 5/8 RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), HMA (High ESAL), or equivalent mixtures. The coarse aggregate in this RAP shall be crushed aggregate and may represent more than one aggregate type and/or quality but shall be at least C quality. This RAP may have an inconsistent gradation and/or asphalt binder content prior to processing. All conglomerate 5/8 RAP shall be processed prior to testing by crushing to where all RAP shall pass the 5/8 in. (16 mm) or smaller screen. Conglomerate 5/8 RAP stockpiles shall not contain steel slag or other expansive material as determined by the Department.
- (c) Conglomerate 3/8. Conglomerate 3/8 RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), HMA (High ESAL), or equivalent mixtures. The coarse aggregate in this RAP shall be crushed aggregate and may represent more than one aggregate type and/or

quality but shall be at least B quality. This RAP may have an inconsistent gradation and/or asphalt binder content prior to processing. All conglomerate 3/8 RAP shall be processed prior to testing by crushing to where all RAP shall pass the 3/8 in (9.5 mm) or smaller screen. Conglomerate 3/8 RAP stockpiles shall not contain steel slag or other expansive material as determined by the Department.

(d) **Conglomerate Variable Size.** Conglomerate variable size RAP shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), HMA (High ESAL), or equivalent mixtures. The coarse aggregate in this RAP shall be crushed aggregate and may represent more than one aggregate type and/or quality but shall be at least B quality. This RAP may have an inconsistent gradation and/or asphalt binder content prior to processing. All conglomerate variable size RAP shall be processed prior to testing by crushing and screening to where all RAP is separated into various sizes. All the conglomerate variable size RAP shall pass the 3/4 in. (19 mm) screen and shall be a minimum of two sizes. Conglomerate variable size RAP stockpiles shall not contain steel slag or other expansive material as determined by the Department.

(e) **Conglomerate "D" Quality (DQ).** Conglomerate DQ RAP stockpiles shall consist of RAP from Class I, Superpave (High or Low ESAL), HMA (High or Low Esal), or equivalent mixtures. The coarse aggregate in this RAP may be crushed or round but shall be at least D quality. This RAP may have an inconsistent gradation and/or asphalt binder content. Conglomerate DQ Rap stockpiles shall not contain steel slag or other expansive material as determined by the Department.

(f) **Non-Quality.** RAP stockpiles that do not meet the requirements of the stockpile categories listed above shall be classified as "Non-Quality".

RAP containing contaminants, such as earth, brick, sand, concrete, sheet asphalt, bituminous surface treatment (i.e. chip seal), pavement fabric, joint sealants, etc., will be unacceptable unless the contaminants are removed to the satisfaction of the Engineer. Sheet asphalt shall be stockpiled separately.

1031.03 Testing. When used in HMA, the RAP shall be sampled and tested either during or after stockpiling.

For testing during stockpiling, washed extraction samples shall be run at the minimum frequency of one sample per 500 tons (450 metric tons) for the first 2000 tons (1800 metric tons) and one sample per 2000 tons (1800 metric tons) thereafter. A minimum of five tests shall be required for stockpiles less than 4000 tons (3600 metric tons).

For testing after stockpiling, the Contractor shall submit a plan for approval to the District proposing a satisfactory method of sampling and testing the RAP pile either in-situ or by restockpiling. The sampling plan shall meet the minimum frequency required above and detail the procedure used to obtain representative samples throughout the pile for testing.

Before extraction, each field sample shall be split to obtain two samples of test sample size. One of the two test samples from the final split shall be labeled and stored for Department use. The Contractor shall extract the other

test sample according to Department procedure. The Engineer reserves the right to test any sample (split or Department-taken) to verify Contractor test results.

- (a) Testing Conglomerate 3/8 and Conglomerate Variable Size. In addition to the requirements above, conglomerate 3/8 and variable size RAP shall be tested for maximum theoretical specific gravity (G_{mm}) at a frequency of one sample per 500 tons (450 metric tons) for the first 2000 tons (1800 metric tons) and one sample per 2000 tons (1800 metric tons) thereafter. A minimum of five tests shall be required for stockpiles less than 4000 tons (3600 metric tons).
- (b) Evaluation of Test Results. All of the extraction results shall be compiled and averaged for asphalt binder content and gradation and, when applicable G_{mm} . Individual extraction test results, when compared to the averages, will be accepted if within the tolerances listed below.

If more than 20 percent of the individual sieves are out of the gradation tolerances, or if more than 20 percent of the asphalt binder content test results fall outside the appropriate tolerances, the RAP shall not be used in HMA unless the RAP representing the failing tests is removed from the stockpile. All test data and acceptance ranges shall be sent to the District for evaluation.

With the approval of the Engineer, the ignition oven may be substituted for extractions according to the Illinois Test Procedure, "Calibration of the

Ignition Oven for the Purpose of Characterizing Reclaimed Asphalt Pavement (RAP)".

1031.04 Quality Designation of Aggregate in RAP. The quality of the RAP shall be set by the lowest quality of coarse aggregate in the RAP stockpile and are designated as follows.

- (a) RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), or HMA (High ESAL) surface mixtures are designated as containing Class B quality coarse aggregate.
- (b) RAP from Superpave (Low ESAL)/HMA (Low ESAL) IL-19.0L binder and IL-9.5L surface mixtures are designated as Class D quality coarse aggregate.
- (c) RAP from Class I, Superpave (High ESAL), or HMA (High ESAL) binder mixtures, bituminous base course mixtures, and bituminous base course widening mixtures are designated as containing Class C quality coarse aggregate.
- (d) RAP from bituminous stabilized subbase and BAM shoulders are designated as containing Class D quality coarse aggregate.

1031.05 Use of RAP in HMA. The use of RAP in HMA shall be as follows.

- (a) Coarse Aggregate Size. The coarse aggregate in all RAP shall be equal to or less than the nominal maximum size requirement for the HMA mixture to be produced.
- (b) Steel Slag Stockpiles. RAP stockpiles containing steel slag or other expansive material, as determined by the Department, shall be homogeneous and will be approved for use in HMA (High ESAL and Low ESAL) surface mixtures only.
- (c) Use in HMA Surface Mixtures (High and Low ESAL). RAP stockpiles for use in HMA surface mixtures (High and Low ESAL) shall be either homogeneous or conglomerate 3/8 or variable size in which the coarse aggregate is Class B quality or better.
- (d) Use in HMA Binder Mixtures (High and Low ESAL), HMA Base Course, and HMA Base Course Widening. RAP stockpiles for use in HMA binder mixtures (High and Low ESAL), HMA base course, and HMA base course widening shall be homogeneous, conglomerate 5/8, or conglomerate 3/8, conglomerate variable size, in which the coarse aggregate is Class C quality or better.
- (e) Use in Shoulders and Subbase. RAP stockpiles for use in HMA shoulders and stabilized subbase (HMA) shall be homogeneous, conglomerate 5/8, conglomerate 3/8, conglomerate variable size, or conglomerate DQ.
- (f) The use of RAP shall be a contractor's option when constructing HMA in all contracts. When the contractor chooses the RAP option, the percentage of RAP shall not exceed the amounts indicated in the table for a given N Design.

1031.06 HMA Mix Designs. At the Contractor's option, HMA mixtures may be constructed utilizing RAP material meeting the above detailed requirements.

RAP designs shall be submitted for volumetric verification. If additional RAP stockpiles are tested and found that no more than 20 percent of the results, as defined under "Testing" herein, are outside of the control tolerances set for the original RAP stockpile and HMA mix design, and meets all of the requirements herein, the additional RAP stockpiles may be used in the original mix design at the percent previously verified.

1031.07 HMA Production. The coarse aggregate in all RAP used shall be equal to or less than the nominal maximum size requirement for the HMA mixture being produced.

To remove or reduce agglomerated material, a scalping screen, crushing unit, or comparable sizing device approved by the Engineer shall be used in the RAP feed system to remove or reduce oversized material. If material passing the sizing device adversely affects the mix production or quality of the mix, the sizing device shall be set at a size specified by the Engineer.

If the RAP control tolerances or QC/QA test results require corrective action, the Contractor shall cease production of the mixture containing RAP and either switch to the virgin aggregate design or submit a new RAP design. When producing mixtures containing conglomerate 3/8 or conglomerate variable size RAP, a positive dust control system shall be utilized.

HMA plants utilizing RAP shall be capable of automatically recording and printing the following information.

- (a) Drier Drum Plants

(1) Date, month, year, and time to the nearest minute for each print.

(2) HMA Mix number assigned by the Department

(3) Accumulated weight of dry aggregate (combined or individual) in tons (metric tons) Accumulated weight of dry aggregate (combined or individual) in tons (metric tons) to the nearest 0.1 ton (0.1 metric ton)

(4) Accumulated dry weight of RAP in tons (metric tons) to the nearest 0.1 ton (0.1 metric ton)

(5) Accumulated mineral filler in revolutions, tons (metric tons), etc. to the nearest 0.1 unit.

(6) Accumulated asphalt binder in gallons (liters), tons (metric tons), etc. to the nearest 0.1 unit.

(7) Residual asphalt binder in the RAP material (per size) as a percent of the total mix to the nearest 0.1 unit.

(8) Aggregate and RAP moisture compensators in percent as set on the control panel (Required when accumulated or individual aggregate and RAP are printed in wet condition).

(b) Batch Plants

(1) Date, month, year, and time to the nearest minute for each print.

(2) HMA mix number assigned by the Department.

(3) Individual virgin aggregate hot bin batch weights to the nearest pound (kilogram)

(4) Mineral filler weight to the nearest pound (kilogram).

(5) Individual RAP Aggregate weight to the nearest pound (kilogram).

(6) Virgin asphalt binder weight to the nearest pound (kilogram)

(7) Residual asphalt binder of each RAP size material as a percent of the total mix to the nearest 0.1 percent.

The printouts shall be maintained in a file at the plant for a minimum of one year or as directed by the Engineer and shall be made available upon request. The printing system will be inspected by the Engineer prior to production and verified at the beginning of each construction season thereafter.

1031.08 RAP in Aggregate Surface Course and Aggregate Shoulders.
The use of RAP in aggregate surface course and aggregate shoulders shall be as follows.

- (a) Stockpiles and Testing. RAP stockpiles may be any of those listed in Article 1031.02, except "Other". The testing requirements of Article 1031.03 shall not apply.
- (b) Gradation. One hundred percent of the RAP material shall pass the 1 1/2 in. (37.5 mm) sieve. The RAP material shall be reasonably well graded from coarse to fine. RAP material that is gap-graded or single sized will not be accepted."

Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Low voltage installation, maintenance and removal of telecommunication facilities (voice, sound, data and video) including telephone and data inside wire, interconnect, terminal equipment, central offices, PABX, fiber optic cable and equipment, micro waves, V-SAT, bypass, CATV, WAN (wide area networks), LAN (local area networks), and ISDN (integrated system digital network), pulling of wire in raceways, but not the installation of raceways.

MARBLE FINISHER

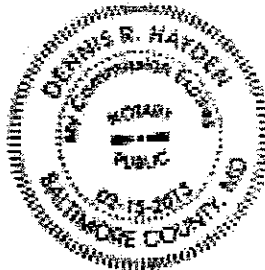

SUBJECT: Quarterly Financial Reports - First Quarter Fiscal 2010

Attached please find **General Fund** financial reports for the first quarter of fiscal year 2010.

Staff will have a power point presentation at the September 14th Board meeting to go over the first quarter financial report in detail.

The Finance Committee discussed the methodology of preparing expenditure estimates and all agreed on the following:

- Staff will assume all projects, positions and services in the budget will be completed. This will give the board a complete financial picture and a good starting point to evaluate if and when projects will be deferred or deleted.
- At the same time staff will go through departmental line item budgets to identify **additional** items that can be deferred. The updated deferral list can be found on pages 6-8. The projects are organized by department and are in no particular order or priority. Some of the projects are time sensitive such as brush pick-up and a decision on these needs to be made as required.

First Quarter Revenue Highlights

Revenues for the General Fund are projected to come in 3.1% below budget or \$246,016.

- **Sales Tax** - To date sales tax receipts are coming in as anticipated.
- **Income Tax** - Income tax receipts are trending about 20% below the budgeted amount. Revised numbers just received from the Illinois Municipal League project a shortfall of 15.5%. To be on the conservative side staff projected a 20% decrease through the year.

- **Utility Tax** - Based on first quarter receipts, staff anticipates a \$67,500 shortfall in utility taxes that can be attributed to taxes received from Nicor. The Village receives utility taxes on gross revenues charged and not on the number of therms used. Because the price per therm is at a near record low, the village is experiencing reduced revenues.

First Quarter Expenditure Highlights

Taking into account the Finance Committee's methodology, total expenditures for the General Fund are projected to come in at \$7,891,236, which is \$10,408 above the budgeted amount of \$7,880,828.

- For the majority of departments, staff has anticipated spending at or less than budgeted amounts. Increases in operating expenses include personnel costs in administration and attorney fees. For projection purposes it was assumed the Village Administrator position will be filled on January 1, 2010.

Fund Balance

The following fund balance and number of days operating expense assumes filling vacant positions and completing projects/purchases included in the budget.

The projected 4/30/10 fund balance is expected to be about \$3,193,000, which is \$186,000 lower than the budgeted fund balance of \$3,379,402.

- The projected deficit at 4/30/2010 is \$245,575.
- The projected fund balance at 4/30/10 equates to 154 days of operating expense compared to the budgeted number of 163 days.

Based on the reduced revenue projections and uncertainty of the economy, deferring/deleting projects continues to be the prudent path to follow. Please see pages 7-9 for a list of deferral items to be discussed. If expenditure items are deferred, the projected deficit and number of days operating expenses will improve for this fiscal year.
