MAY 2011

May 01, 2011 R/O spoke to the victim at the station in reference to Identity Theft (Case # 11-3245). The victim stated her Credit Union Debit Card was used in Georgia to purchase items. The Credit Union requested she file an information with her local Police Department. On May 5, 2011 a call was placed to the victim. The Officer's were very helpful with making the report she needed for the Credit Union. She is working with the Credit Union on their investigation.




