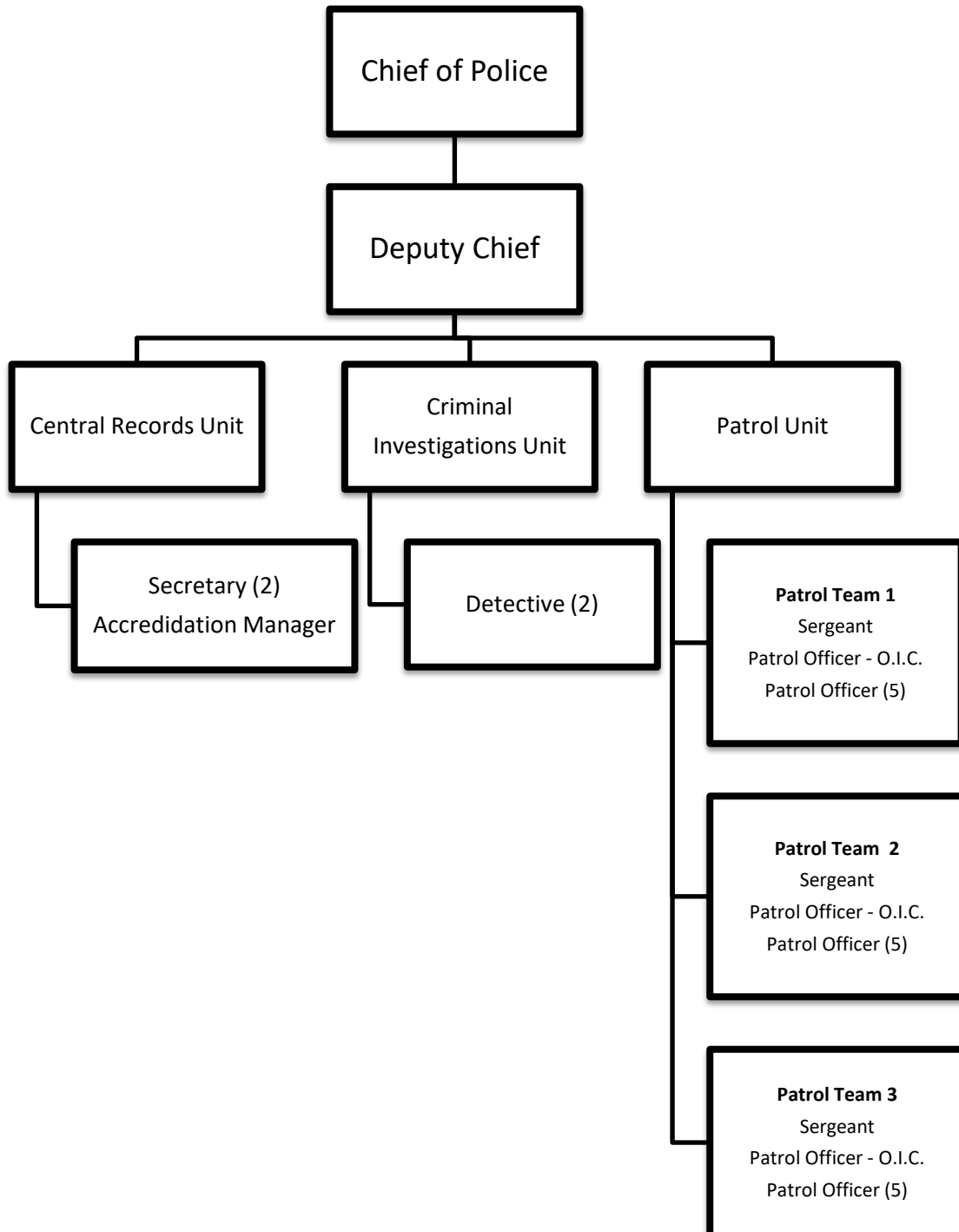

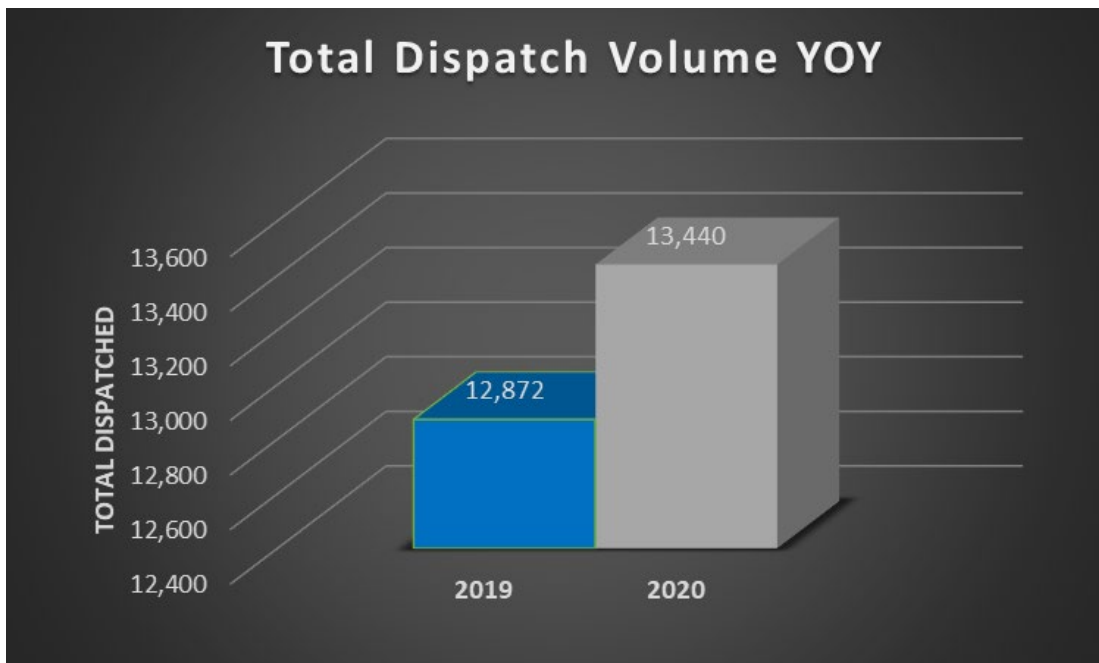

2020 = 13,440



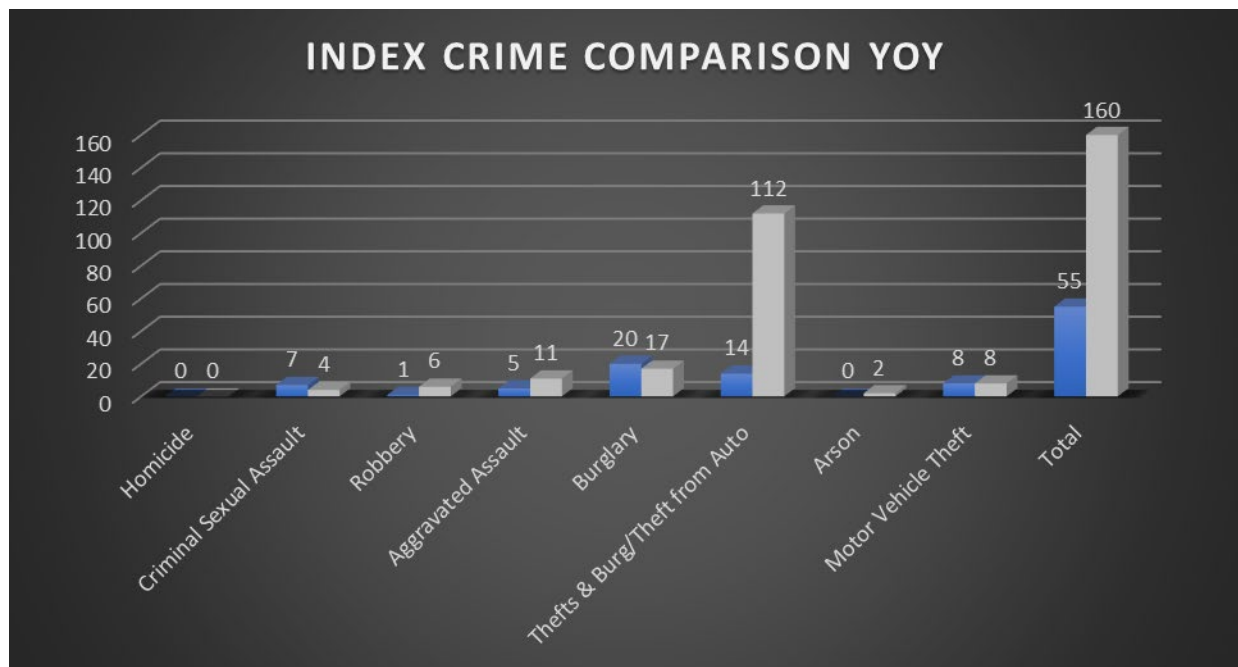

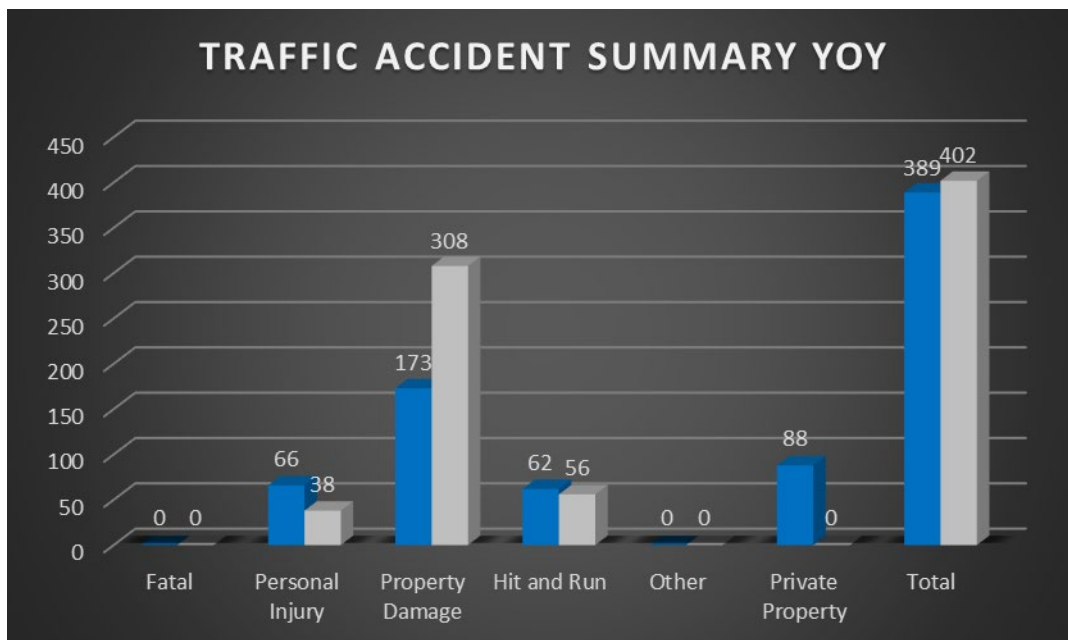

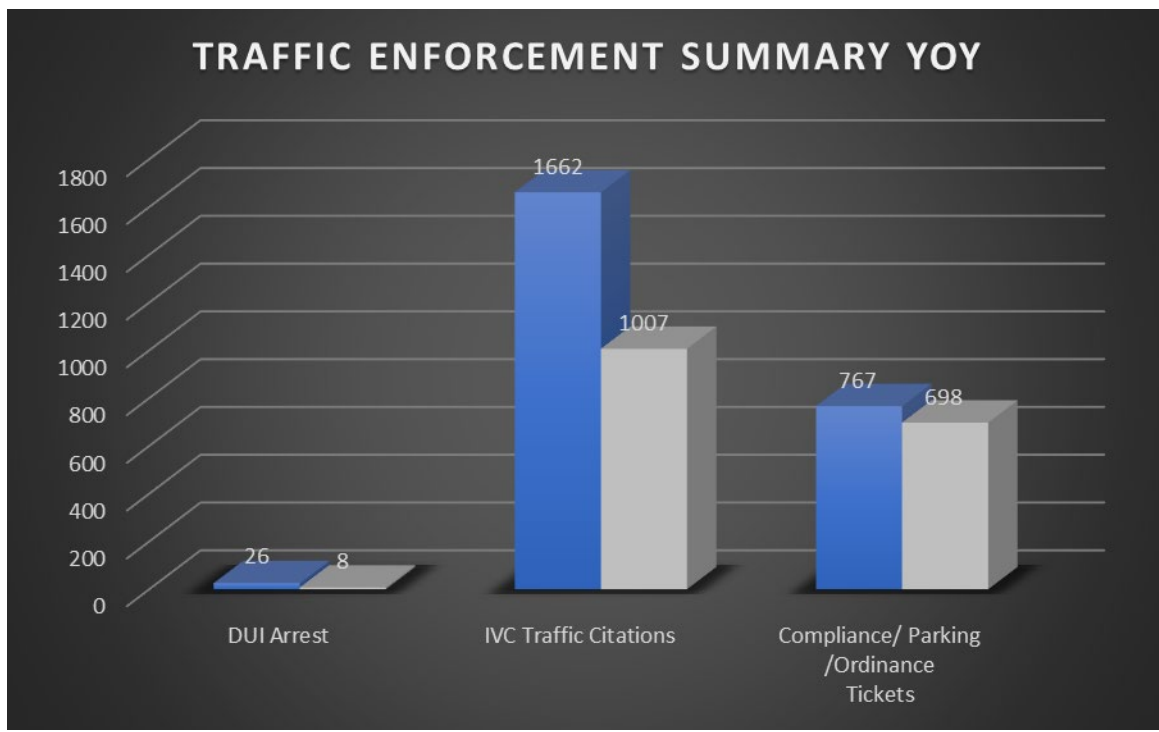

TRAINING

Ongoing and continued specialized training are a priority with the police department. Officers received over (400) hours of in-house service training which included Law Review, Range Training, Less Lethal Training, Hazardous and Bloodborne Pathogen Training and other various applicable specialties.

Some of the specialized training attended by officers included Midwest Forensic Training Conference, Staff and Command, Investigative Skills, Internal Affairs and Professional Standards, Financial Crime Investigation, Tactical Pistol Training, Crisis Intervention, Street Crimes Seminar, Firearms Training Course, Major Case Investigations Team Training and numerous other law enforcement related fields.

In continuing professional career training and specialties, the department takes a proactive approach to training officers. In preparation for future retirements, the officers' training needs to be established and being strong proponents of training should accomplish this. Our compliment of trained, experienced officers will continue. This allows our newer officers to not only receive the required certification but also glean from the senior Officers experience to make a more well-rounded officer.

COVID 19 PANDEMIC RESPONSE



With the Stay-at-Home order during the pandemic, the Department recognized the stress and anxiety it caused on our youth. To help keep their young minds focused on positivity, we offered a drive past with lights and sirens to help our youngest residents celebrate their birthday.

To help keep our Police Officers healthy and able to serve and protect our Village, its residents and business, we invested in a BIOMIST sanitizing system to use in our squad cars and station. The BIOMIST system is also used to sanitize the Public Works vehicles as well as frequently used areas within the Village Hall.

SPEED WATCH PROGRAM



The Willowbrook Police Department's speed trailer is currently available for use in neighborhoods, school zones, construction sites, and dangerous roads where the speed of vehicles could be a problem. This unit is a portable, self-contained speed display unit that is towed to sites experiencing speed-related problems. A specially designed radar is mounted inside the locked trailer, clocking speeds. Motorists see their speeds displayed on a highly visible LED (light emitting diode) display.

The speed trailer display reminds motorists to pay attention and SLOW DOWN. For those who refuse, warnings and citations can be issued by an officer who may decide to wait up the street for those violators. With fewer speed-related accidents, officers' time is freed up and they can concentrate their efforts in other crime fighting ways. Plus, citizens feel safer, which is what compliance with the speed limit is all about: safety.
