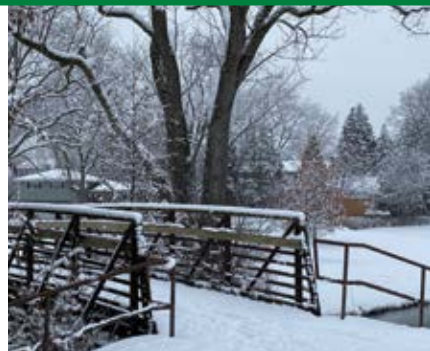

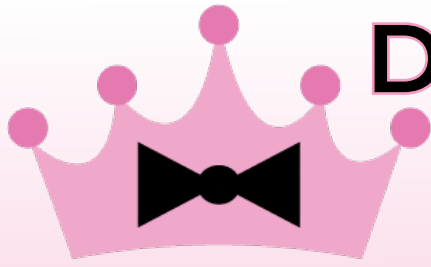

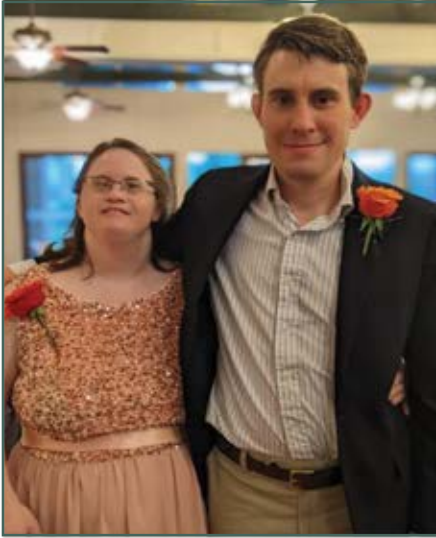

CIP OPEN HOUSE

A Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is a financial planning, budgeting, and management tool that calls for strategic investments in the Village's infrastructure, such as roads, sidewalks, water lines, public facilities, and equipment. The CIP also includes projects pertaining to heavy machinery, building improvements, vehicles, and repairs. These projects are largely funded by the General Fund, Water fund and grants.

UPCOMING AND ONGOING IMPROVEMENTS

• Midway Park Improvement Project

The Midway Park Improvement Project has had four requests for bids to solicit contractors for the work needed for the park. The bids were grading, utilities, permeable paver parking lots, and recreational amenities installation. The Village Board approved the construction bid for the grading and utilities, which was won by Martam Construction, at the July 10th Board Meeting. The recreational amenities installation is in negotiation at the time of this update and the permeable paver parking lot bid was opened in July and will be awarded in August.

• Borse Park Improvement Project

Phase I portion of the Borse Park Improvement Project will begin with the installation of the Eleanor Place permeable paver parking lot. This installation will take place in the Fall 2023. In addition, the stormwater infrastructure in the park will be replaced and upgraded in the fall after the BRW Fall softball season. These components of the project will enable future portions of the phase development to occur without major disruptions to park activities.

• Creekside Park Improvement Project Open House

For fiscal year 24-25, the Village is preparing and planning for improvements to Creekside Park. As a result, the Village will be hosting an Open House on Thursday, Oct 12th from 5-7pm at the Community Resource Center to share playground concepts and general concept ideas and gather community feedback. We look forward to the neighborhood participating and providing feedback to improve your park.

• Farmingdale Terrace Park Improvement Project Open House

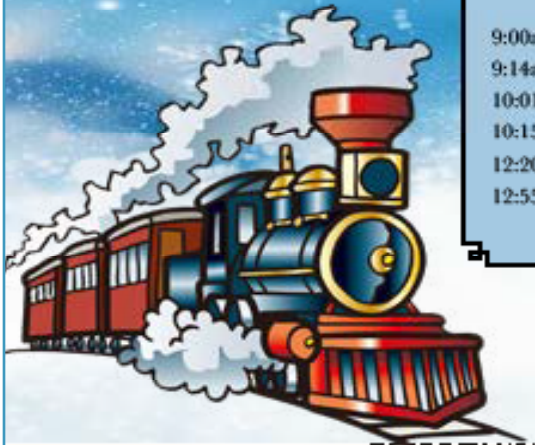

9-YEAR-OLD'S LOVE FOR CODING BEGAN AT IPPL

When Parker Mayberry was 3, she came to the library and played with a coding caterpillar during a library program (picture below).

Fast-forward nearly six years later, and Parker, along with a team of four other girls, won a national coding competition sponsored by IBM and Black Girls Code.

"It was during that moment, playing with that caterpillar, that Parker sparked an interest in coding," said Courtney Wade, her mother. "I never thought that program would lead to her winning a national competition, especially at a young age."

Parker was the youngest member of the team, which created a chat bot to answer questions about recycling. The girls worked on the project over Zoom. In late fall 2022, they traveled to New York and presented their project at IBM. "It was so much fun to travel to New York," said Parker. "My school library and librarians at IPPL helped me find stories to support my project."

In addition to coding, Parker loves reading, Girl Scouts, and playing with her friends. She and her mom often visit the library for "tons and tons of books." Parker recently learned to sew in the library's Maker Studio, and now sews on her own Girl Scout badges.

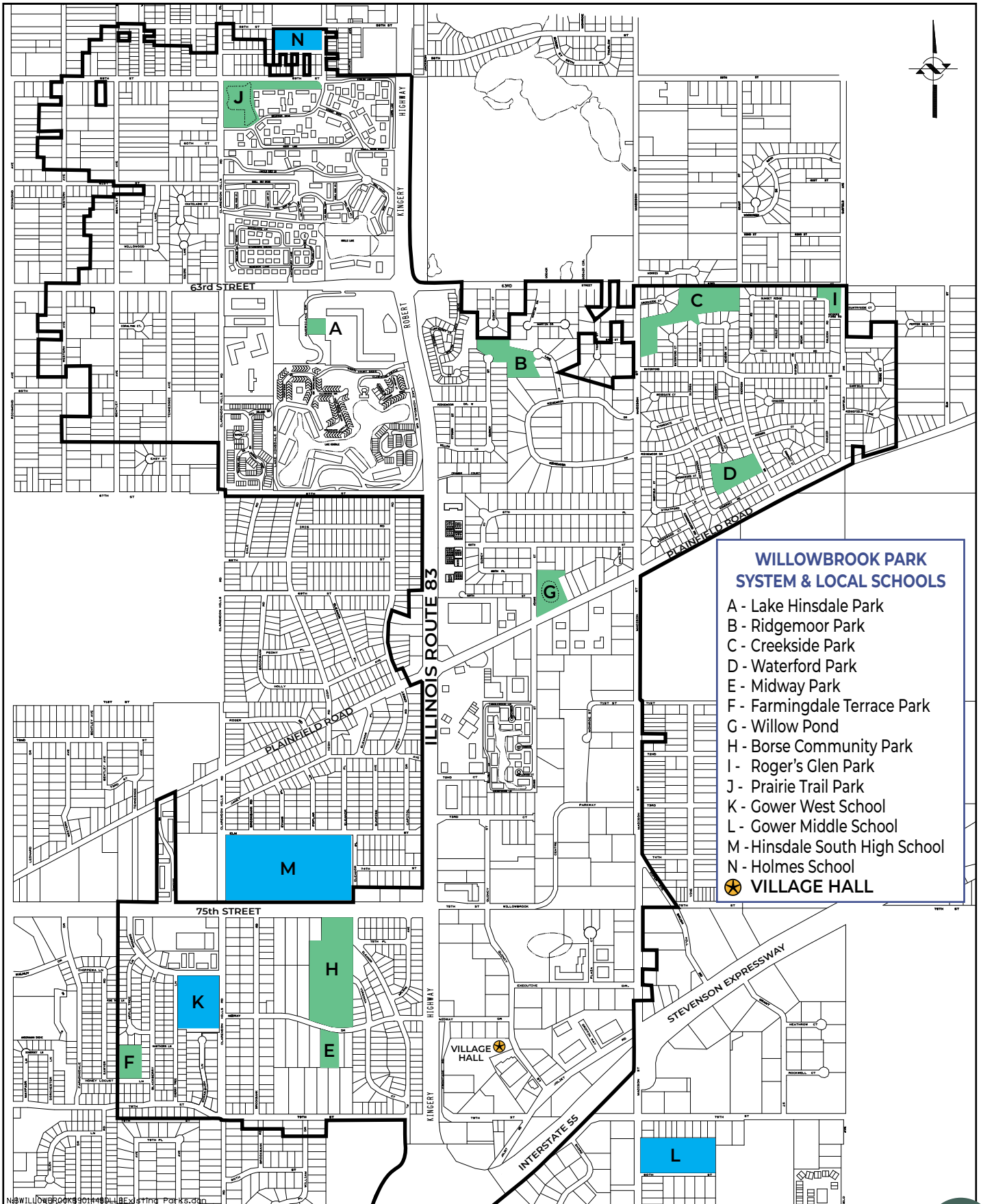

SPLASH PAD

The Splash Pad is located at Willow Pond Park (NE corner of Plainfield Rd. and Adams Street). It is open daily from 10am to 6pm, beginning Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day.



PARK PERMITS

Park permits are available for you to reserve park shelters, ball fields and other areas for family outings, picnics and corporate events.

Park permits are required for any groups in excess of 25 individuals.

Call the Village Hall at (630) 323-8215 to determine that the facilities and the date you desire are available.

Obtain a Park Permit Application and Fee Schedule in person from the Village Hall. You may also obtain an application online at www.willowbrookil.org. Just click on Parks and Recreation and go to the Park Permits link. There you will also see the permit fee schedule.

If your place and date are available, we can reserve it for you up to 7 days in advance in order to give you time to submit the application and the entire permit fee. The Village Hall is open Monday through Friday from 8:30A - 4:30P. You may also fax the application to the Village at (630) 323-0787 and then call to pay by credit card.

PARK PERMIT PROCEDURES

Residents and others can reserve park shelters and other areas for family outings, picnics, and corporate events.

HOW TO OBTAIN A PARK PERMIT:

1. Review the usage policy and fee schedule

A small convenience fee will be charged for this service: credit cards will be charged \$3.95 and debit cards will be charged \$1.95 per transaction. Official Payments, the service provider, charges this convenience fee for processing each transaction. This fee is not charged by or paid to the Village of Willowbrook.

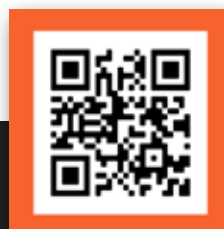

PROCEDURES

1. All Village of Willowbrook resident registration forms received before August 21 will be held and randomly processed as the first batch of registrations on August 21. Non-resident registration begins August 28.
2. If a program chosen has an opening available, your registration is processed and a receipt confirmation will be mailed within approximately 5 working days.
3. If programs chosen have reached maximum enrollment, your name will be placed on a waiting list, and you will be notified. Every attempt is made to accommodate the persons on these lists. Please be sure to read through the receipt message carefully for an explanation of your registration status.

PROOF OF RESIDENCY

Policies set forth by the Village of Willowbrook Board of Trustees define a resident as anyone living within the boundary of the Village of Willowbrook. Anyone working or operating a business within the Village of Willowbrook boundaries, but living outside the boundaries shall not be considered a resident. We don't always recognize our neighbors; from time to time, we may ask to see proof of residency when you register for programs in person. All new residents must show proof of residency.

ACCIDENT POLICY

The Village of Willowbrook does not provide medical insurance coverage for injuries suffered while participating in Village programs, or while using park facilities. The Village therefore, can assume no responsibility for personal injury while participating in recreation programs or while using park facilities.

NON-RESIDENT FEE

Part of the cost of programs is assumed with tax dollars. Therefore, those who are not residents of the Village of Willowbrook will be assessed a non-resident fee. Non-residents pay an additional fee per program. Day Camp and Leagues may have different non-resident fee structures. See program for details.

SATISFACTION GUARANTEED REFUND POLICY

A full refund will be issued if you are dissatisfied after the 1st class with the program or the program is cancelled by the park district. A prorated withdrawal refund will be made for participants who decide, for whatever personal reason (including injury or illness), that an ongoing program is not right for them. The prorated refund will be based on the number of classes that have occurred at the time the Refund Request form is received by the Parks & Recreation Department. The Director of Parks & Recreation will consider exceptions to this policy due to other extenuating circumstances. The Refund policy excludes trip tickets, adult sports leagues and special events. Please allow two weeks to receive your refund check in the mail.

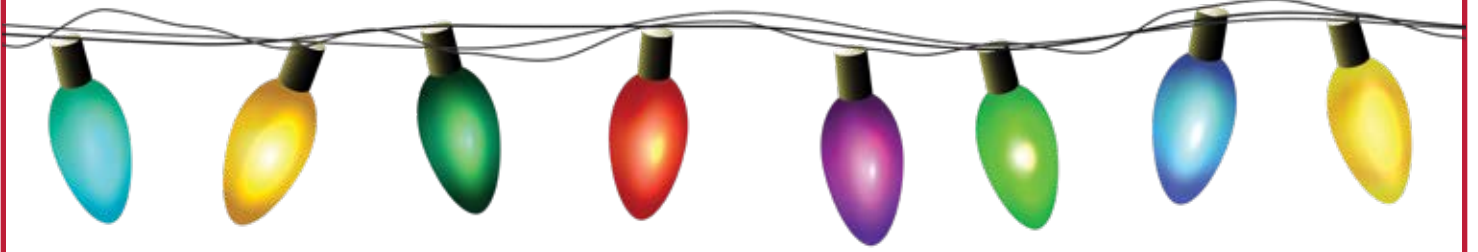
