Subject: Snow Removal & Plowing - Don't Bury Critical ComEd Equipment in the Snow

Dear Customer:

ComEd is planning for the winter months. In preparation, we have provided the following guidelines:

There may be ComEd transformers and/or switchgear on your property that may need to be accessed in the winter. Occasionally after a snowstorm, snow removal efforts will result in buried or blocked access to critical ComEd equipment. Occasionally, a snowplow will move snow into our equipment, damaging it and possibly causing a loss in power.

If there is a need to access ComEd equipment, at least ten feet of open space in front of the equipment's cabinet doors is required. Additionally, at least one (1) foot of clearance on the remaining three (3) sides of the equipment is necessary.

To the extent there is ComEd equipment along your plow routes or in parking lots you maintain, please remind your snow removal teams to avoid piling snow on or around ComEd equipment. Doing so may damage equipment which may lead to a loss in power. This may delay restoration of power due to ComEd's inability to gain access. If you do lose power, call 1-800-EDISON-1 to start the restoration process.
