
FALL REMINDERS

VILLAGE WIDE STREET SWEEPING

Please refrain from parking on all curbed Village streets November 20 - 22 from 7 AM - 4 PM.

FALL VILLAGE TREE PLANTING

If you had a tree planted this fall, please keep it watered until the first snow.



WINTER REMINDERS

During heavy snowfall, the Public Works Crews work around the clock to keep the roads safe. Please be aware of these vital winter reminders to ensure we can get our Village roads clear and safe for our community as soon as possible.

Snow and ice issues on roads not maintained by the Village are the responsibility of the County or State. Please report issues directly to the managing governing body.

- **County Roads:** 63rd, 75th, Plainfield, Madison
- **State Roads:** Route 83/Kingery Hwy, Frontage Rd (Midway Dr to Madison St.)

KEEP ROADS CLEAR

- On-street parking is prohibited any time after 1" of snowfall.
- Remove empty refuse containers from the curb as soon as possible to avoid contact with the snowplows.
- Please clear the storm drain covers, sidewalks, and fire hydrants near your property.
- Report inaccessible fire hydrants or snow piles obstructing drivers' views; please report the location by calling 630-920-2238 or clicking "Request for Service" on the Village website.
- It is against the Village Code to blow or place snow into the street; this causes hazardous conditions.

IT TAKES A "VILLAGE"

- Plowing and snow placement on neighborhood streets, especially cul-de-sacs, becomes problematic as temperatures drop. The Village will clear snow from curbs; however, residents should expect to have to remove some of the snow from mailbox areas. In addition, the plow drivers cannot avoid plowing snow onto driveway aprons.
- If your mailbox is damaged during snow removal, please call 630-920-2238 or report it on the website; the Village will deliver a temporary mailbox to you. Repairs to your mailbox will be completed when the weather clears.

Attention Snow Birds

Planning on leaving for warmer weather? If a pipe bursts or leaks while you are away, it could cause significant damage. Consider completely turning off the water supply if you will be away for an extended period of time. Contact the Village Public Works Department at 630-323-8215 for more information.

HOLIDAY SEASON SAFETY



Watch out for Pickpockets & Identity Theft While Holiday Shopping.

- Do not carry your social security card.
- Don't get distracted while in crowded areas, it leaves your personal belongings at risk.
- Limit the use of your cell phone in public.

- Park in well-lit areas with frequent travel.
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages when walking alone.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Leave nothing visible in your car when parked outside.
- Keep packages in the truck.




Credit Card Safety

Appointment of New Deputy Chief

In 2022, the Willowbrook Police Department underwent a department reorganization and added a second Deputy Chief position. With the retirement of Chief Robert Schaller and promotion of Chief Lauren Kaspar in May of 2023, a vacancy was created in the position of Deputy Chief of Operations.

After a rigorous recruitment and interview process, the Department appointed Gerard Wodka to the position of Deputy Chief of Operations. Deputy Chief Wodka has over 28 years of dedicated experience in public service. Prior to his retirement, Deputy Chief Wodka served the Palos Heights Police Department for over 17 years retiring with the rank of Sergeant. Deputy Chief Wodka was sworn in on October 23rd, 2023. The Village looks forward to the experience he will bring to the Department.

Annual CALEA Accreditation



In October of 2023, the Willowbrook Police Department participated in their year two web-based assessment with the Commission of Law Enforcement Accreditation (CALEA). The web-based assessment is completed annually and requires opening up our policies, procedures, and practices to outside oversight with a CALEA Compliance Service Member. This is done through remote examination and virtual interview of staff. The annual web-based assessments are used in conjunction with the on-site assessment with CALEA Assessor on the fourth year to determine compliance with CALEA standards to achieve a reaccreditation award.

OPEN BURN POLICY

DuPage County and the municipalities within the Tri-State Fire Protection District, including the Village of Willowbrook, have adopted ordinances that prohibit various forms of open burning of leaves, sticks, logs, branches, and other landscape waste originating on the owner's property.

PERMITS

The mission of the Community Development Department is to provide the community with comprehensive service in the areas of building and property maintenance code compliance, building permits, plan review, and resident concerns in an efficient manner to provide and ensure public safety for the community.

WINTER IS COMING

Check your home's heating and air conditioning system.

- Replace your furnace filter every three months.
- **Reminder:** A permit is required to replace your furnace.

Caulk your windows and seal exterior doors.

- Most home repair stores stock weather stripping and window seal caulk
- **Reminder:** A permit is required to replace your windows and front door.

Remove all hoses from spigots to prevent pipes freezing and bursting. Check ALL drainage systems.

Shut off the water supply to irrigation systems to protect against freezing pipes

Clean your gutters to prevent ice and snow damming, which can lead cause leaks and water damage to your home.

If possible, trim back tree branches that overhang the house

Test and clean the dust off your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

Clean your fireplace by removing soot and debris from the firebox and chimney before the first ignition.

Check the expiration date on your home fire extinguishers and replace as needed.

Train all household members on using a fire extinguisher properly and NEVER use water to put out candle wax or oil fires.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATION A YEAR IN REVIEW

2023 PROJECT & CAPITAL INVESTMENT RECAP

CHERRY TREE LANE SIDEWALK

Work began on August 1st to complete a 1000-foot-long stretch of new sidewalk from 7715 Cherry Tree Lane to the intersection of Sheridan Drive and Cherry Tree Lane. This project was completed by Falco's Landscaping. The project was completed in seven days and came in \$8,000 under budget.

WILLOW MANOR STORM DESIGN

The Willow Manor subdivision, located between Rt. 83 and Madison Street just north of Plainfield Road has had ongoing standing water/drainage issues within the Village rights-of-way. Staff hired Novotny Engineering to complete a storm water management plan of this area and design an improvement plan. The survey has been completed and staff is reviewing improvement plan options.

STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS

Twelve streetlights along Adams Street, south of Plainfield Road are scheduled to be upgraded from vapor halogen streetlights to LED. This project is scheduled to be completed by the end of December.

EXECUTIVE DRIVE STORM WATER MANAGEMENT

Executive Drive was constructed in the early 1970s. Excess storm water is stored on top of the existing roadway, which makes that street impassable for days and affects business owners and their customers. A redevelopment plan was created by Burke Engineering. The Village hosted a bid opening on June 20th, but bids came in higher than anticipated. The Village will be releasing this bid by the end of the year and anticipate lower-cost submittals. This project has been moved to the 2024-2025 fiscal year.

MIDWAY PARK UPGRADES

Midway Park upgrades began in August. The park started as an open lot and will be furnished with a permeable paver parking lot, an ice/roller hockey rink, whiffle ball field, an exercise court, a bathroom and pavilion structure, and a perimeter walking path.

BORSE MEMORIAL COMMUNITY PARK PHASE I

Borse Memorial Community Park will be enhanced over the next three years. Phase I consists of constructing a permeable paver parking lot on the corner of 75th Street and Eleanor Place and replacing critical drainage lines throughout the park.

The Village looks forward to next year and a new set of projects to continuously improve our systems, operations, and offerings to the Village.
