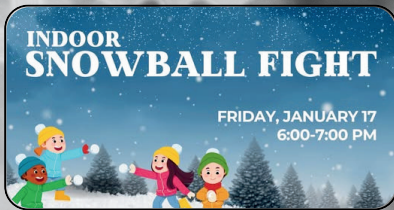

### Important Information About Your Drinking Water

#### Availability of Monitoring Data for Unregulated Contaminants for the Village of Willowbrook, State Water System ID# IL0431100

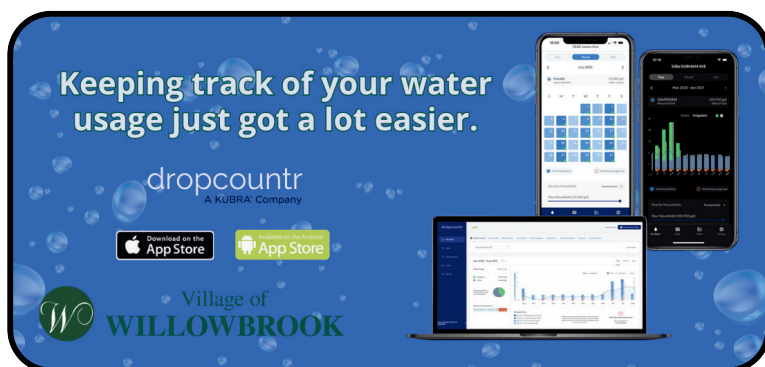
The Village of Willowbrook water system has been sampled for a series of unregulated contaminants. Unregulated contaminants are those that do not yet have a drinking water standard set by the EPA. The purpose of monitoring for these contaminants is to help the EPA decide whether the contaminants should have a standard. As our customers, you have a right to know that this data is available. ## Changes to Chicago's Water Treatment Methods

The Village receives Lake Michigan source water treated by the City of Chicago and transmitted from Chicago to Willowbrook through the DuPage Water Commission (DWC). Neither the DWC nor Willowbrook conducts any water treatment but only conveys the treated water from Chicago.

Over the next few months, the City of Chicago is changing some of its water treatment methods. Chicago has been utilizing blended phosphates in their treatment process which reduce lead levels by forming a protective coating on the inside of a customer's lead service lines. Chicago has stated there should be no change noticed in water quality levels for customers who receive water from Chicago.
