Important Information About Your Drinking Water

Your home may be served by an unknown material service line that could contain lead. To improve water quality, the Village will be replacing all lead service lines, but we need your help! In the coming weeks, watch your mail for a short survey to help us identify your home's water line type.

Health Risks of Lead: Lead can pose serious health risks, particularly to children and pregnant women.

Ways to Reduce Exposure:

- **Flush Water:** Run taps for 1–2 minutes (no lead line) or 3–5 minutes (with lead line).
- **Use Cold Water:** For drinking, cooking, and baby formula.
- **Use Alternatives:** Consider bottled water or certified filters.
- **Clean Aerators:** Regularly remove debris.
- **No Boiling:** Boiling doesn't remove lead.
- **Install Lead-Free Fixtures:** Use lead-free faucets and plumbing.

Summer Safety Reminder

With school being out for the summer, more kids will be out and about, especially in neighborhoods. Please SLOW down and use the following precautions:

- Day or night, drive with your headlights on so children can see you.
- When approaching parked cars, always expect a child to run out into the roadway.
- Look for bicycles, sporting equipment, and other indicators kids may be at play in the area.
- Before backing, scan the area around your car, double-check mirrors, and windows, and use a rearview camera.

On most roadways, bicyclists (including those on electric bikes) have the same rights and responsibilities as other roadway users. The following are important safety tips regarding bicyclists:

- Drivers must yield the right of way to a bicyclist just as they would to another vehicle.
- When passing a bicyclist, do so slowly and leave at least 3 feet of passing space.
- Bicyclists should wear equipment to make them more visible to others, including but not limited to a helmet, bright clothing with reflective clothing being preferred, and lights on the front and rear of the bicycle.
- Bicyclists should assume drivers do not see them. Make eye contact with drivers to ensure everyone's intentions are clear.
- Be aware of opening car doors, cars backing out of driveways or parking spots, and roadway hazards.

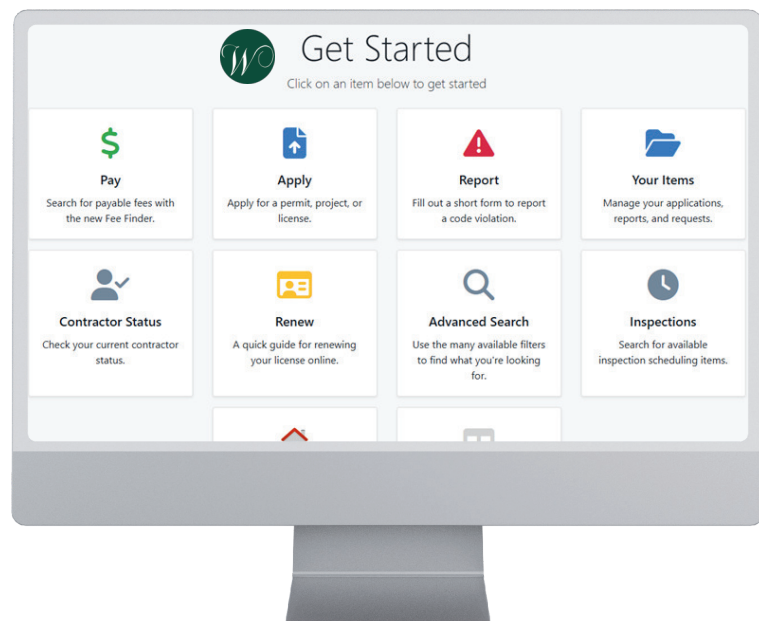
Community Development
