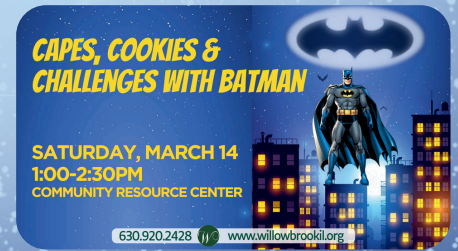
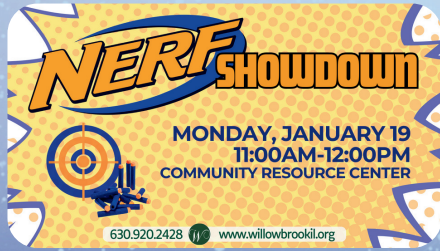

Public Works

Snow & Ice Removal

Please help keep our roads safe and clear. Avoid parking on the street after one inch of snowfall, and remove empty refuse containers from the curb as soon as possible to prevent interference with snowplows. Clearing storm drain covers, sidewalks, and fire hydrants near your property is also an important part of winter safety. If you see a fire hydrant that cannot be reached or snow piles that may block a driver's view, report the location by calling 630-920-2238 or by using the Conditions Report form at <https://www.frontlinepss.com/willowbrook>. Remember that blowing or placing snow into the street is prohibited under the Village Code because it creates hazardous conditions.

Help us Get the Lead Out

The Village is working to ensure water quality by identifying and replacing lead service lines. Residents with unknown material lines were mailed a postcard and asked to complete a brief Water Service Line Material Survey. The information will help the Village plan for any lead service line replacement at no cost to homeowners. Please complete the survey within one month of receiving the notice. Village Code Updates

The Village of Willowbrook Village Board approved the adoption of the 2024 International Codes (ICC) and 2023 National Electric Code (NEC). The update took effect on January 1, 2026. The updates are intended to:

- Align Village regulations with current safety and construction standards
- Reduce unnecessary local amendments
- Provide greater consistency and clarity for property owners, contractors, and design professionals

Remember to schedule your final inspection for all permits, including roofs, fences, driveways, windows, doors, and HVAC units. Final inspections make sure the work is done correctly, meets Village codes, and protects public health, safety, and welfare.

Temperature Control

Residents who live in a rental unit or an apartment complex: The 2024 International Property Maintenance Code and The International Residential Code state that the minimum required temperature is 68°F during the heating months. Contact the Village for further questions.
